This Indenture made on the 19th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and thirty three between James Wick of the County of Southampton of the one part and Matthew Williams of the same County of the other part witnesses: That the said James Wick in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged which sum granted bargained and sold and by these presents do give grant bargain and sell unto the said Matthew Williams and his heirs not that tract or parcel of Land which the said Matthew Williams and Piggott his wife conveyed to him by deed of Indenture bargain and sale bearing date the 15th day of October 1830. as in reference thereunto being had will more fully appear containing fifty acres by more or less in the County of Southampton aforesaid and bounded as in the aforementioned deed from Williams and wife to the said James Wick. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land as in the afore mentioned deed described to him the said Matthew Williams and his heirs for ever and the said James Wick for himself his heirs Executors and administrators the aforementioned tract or parcel of Land with its appurtenances unto him the said Matthew Williams against all persons claiming under or from the said James Wick well: release and for ever defend in evidence whereof the said James Wick hath hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year above written Signed sealed and delivered (The Signed 19th of January) entered James Wick (Read in presence of before signed in the said line)

Shado This Indenture made this 12th day of January 1833 between Matthew Williams and Miles Shado both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesses that the said Miles Shado in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to him in hand paid at or before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the said Miles Shado hath bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Matthew Williams all that tract and parcel of Land lying situate and being in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows to wit On the East by the lands of William Davis north by James Jenkins land formerly Mads' West by the lands of John Webb and South by William Swamp. To have and to hold the said tract and parcel of Land and the appurtenances thereto belonging to him and his heirs forever. Containing by estimation thirty acres be the same more or less. And the said Miles Shado do hereby covenant and his heirs do hereby then presently covenant and grant unto the said Matthew Williams his heirs and assigns full firm the Claim or Claims of all and every person whatsoever in law and in equity lawfully then existing. At all Times my hand and seal this 12th day of January 1833. as above written.
