Parker This Indenture made this 24th day of December in the year Eight hundred and thirty
To the within Harrison of the County of Southampton of the first and Edwin Harrison of
Harrison the same County of the second part Whereas the 8th day of March in the year aforesaid
and admitted to record in the land of Southampton did go and transfer and convey to
the said Harrison Parker his heirs and assigns all that tract or parcel of land on
which the said James Peggins resides and all other land in which the said James
Peggins hold an interest the whole being on a Mottoway River in the County
of Southampton adjoining the lands of Harrison Parker and others and containing by
Estimation two hundred acres together with the appurtenances to the said land belonging
In trust and with power and authority to the said Harrison Parker his heirs and
assigns to sell and dispose of the said land or so much of the property mentioned in the
said deed of trust as might be necessary for certain purposes in the same Recor-
proped and whereas the said Harrison Parker in execution of the said trust the time
place and term of sale having been advertised according to the true intent and meaning
of the said deed did expose to sale at Henning's Store for Cash the said tract or parcel
of land and all other lands in which the said James Peggins has and holds any
interest at the time of the execution of the said deed with the appurtenances thereto
belonging at which sale the aforesaid Edwin Harrison being the highest bidder for the
said land at the price of two hundred and thirty five dollars became the purchaser
thereof. Now this Indenture Witnesseth that the said Harrison Parker in fu-
ther Execution of the trust aforesaid and for and in Consideration of the Sum of two hundred
and thirty five dollars by the said Edwin Harrison to the said Harrison Parker
has paid to him by him applied in pursuance of the said trust. To wit the said Edwin
Harrison for the said James Peggins with lawful interest thereon and also for
such sums of money as had have been paid or satisfied by Henning's Store and James C.
Harrison for the said James Peggins with lawful interest as they the said Henning's Store and James C.
Harrison or either of them may be bound for as the said James Peggins security as
may otherwise be entitled to from the said James Peggins under an act of Justice
of the said deed together with the expenses attending the said trust and the ex-
ecution thereof hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth
grant bargain and sell unto the said Edwin Harrison his heirs and assigns
the land and premises herein before particularly described and which was disposed
of at public auction as aforesaid together with the appurtenances thereto belonging
or in anywise appertaining To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of
land and premises hereby conveyed together with its appurtenances to the said
Edwin Harrison his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of the said
Edwin Harrison his heirs and assigns forever And the said Harrison Parker with
the said tract or parcel of land and other premises as hereby conveyed with
appurtenances to the said Edwin Harrison his heirs and assigns against
