these presents do bargain and sell unto the said David R. Sturms his heirs and
assigns all his right title and interest that he may at this or any future time be entitled
to of his father's William Sturms dec'd Estate now in possession of his mother Mary C.
Sturms, consisting of Land negroes personal Estate and all and every part and parcel
thereof that he the said John A. Sturms may be entitled to from said Estate together
with all profits, revenues, heres and heirs of, belonging or appertaining in any
manner to said interest in said Estate. To have and to hold the aforesaid inter-
est in Land negroes money or any other property which he may be so entitled to
every part and parcel thereof unto the said David R. Sturms his heirs and
assigns forever. And the said John A. Sturms for himself his heirs and assigns
free from the claims or claims of himself his heirs and assigns and every other person
or persons what, ever. Shall well and do warrant and forever defend by these presents
the said John A. Sturms his heirs and assigns unto it his hands
and seal the day and year first above written.
