and Susan his wife have bargained sold alined and confirmed and by these presents do give
bargain sell and confirm unto the said Prince his heirs and assigns forever all that the
said Phipps ever had or held or now has or holds or shall or may have of land formerly owned by the
late John Phipps of said County and State situated in said County of Southampton and
bounded as follows On the South and West by the lands of the said Benjamin Phipps and
the North by the lands belonging to the Estate of John Holt on the East by the lands now
by Humphrey Drury and the Estate of John Holt brook. To wit with all the improve-
ments and benefits thereunto belonging unto the said William Prince his heirs and
assigns forever. And the said Benjamin Phipps and Susan his wife and their heirs and
assigns forever to warrant and defend the said premises unto the said William Prince his heirs
and assigns forever against the rights and title of any person or persons whatsoever
that may be witness of the said Benjamin Phipps and Susan his wife have herein
