This Indenture made this 23rd day of January 1833. Between Peter Booth of the County of Southampton of the first part. Henry Ellis of the County of Sussex of the second part and James Little of the County of Sussex of the third part. Witnesseth that whereas the said Peter Booth is party indebted to the said Henry Ellis in the sum of seven hundred dollars due by note bearing even date with these presents and payable on demand and the said Booth has by these presents assigned the debt aforesaid to the said Henry Ellis in consideration thereof as well as for the further consideration of the sum of One dollar to him in hand paid by the said Little before the creating and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged granted bargained and sold and by these presents assigned bargained and sold to the said Little his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Southampton containing by recent survey two hundred and fifty acres more or less and bounded by the lands of Henry Booth and others it being a part of Lands formerly belonging to John Booth dec^d and it being the land on which the said Booth now resides. So have come to hold the said Lands to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Little his heirs & forever and the said Little for his heirs & forever the right and title to the said Land unto the said Little against the claim of himself or against the claim of any other person shall and lawfully forever warrant and defend by these presents. Upon Trust nevertheless it is the true intent of these presents that it shall be lawful for the said Little at any time that the said Ellis shall require to sell to the highest bidder on the premises at at some public place for ready money the Land aforesaid or so much as shall be sufficient to satisfy the debt aforesaid and all reasonable expenses of suit ascertaining the time and place and out of the proceeds pay the debt interest and costs and the over plus if any pay to the said Peter Booth his order.
