

Barker Whereas Howell Barker, late d^d by his last will and Testament bore date in
 To 13th day of June One thousand Eight hundred and twenty two, convey to his wife Mary,
 Barker Barker during her life or widowhood his tract of Land & his negroes and other
 increase (say Jacob Peter Jeffrey, Phoebe Cindrella, Miles and Ben and on the
 Event of either death or marriage of the said Howell Barker to his son (say)
 Gray Barker to him and his heirs forever. And whereas it is contrary to the
 Laws of Virginia that any master should carry away Slaves or slaves out of the
 said State without the approbation of the person or persons to whom the
 simple title is vested. Do hereby agree that my master Howell Barker
 should remove the said slaves to Kentucky or any other State that she
 may wish and that she may have the same right and control over them as
 she would have if she had remained in Virginia. Given under my hand &
 Seal, this 18th day of February 1833.

Upkehead, This Indenture made and entered into this twenty fifth day of September one
 thousand Eight hundred and thirty two between John Whitehead and Mary his wife
 of the one part and Edwin Whitehead of the other part all of the County of
 Southampton aforesaid that the said John Whitehead and Mary his wife
 for and in Consideration of the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars to them
 in hand paid by the said Edwin Whitehead the receipt whereof is hereby
 acknowledged both by these presents granted bargained and sold and do hereby
 grant bargain and sell unto the said Edwin Whitehead his heirs and assigns the
 certain tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Southampton containing
 a late Survey two hundred and eleven acres by the same now left and bounded
 by the lands of Samuel Whitehead, Edward Harris, Josephine Davis and John
 Brown. It being that tract of land which descents to me by virtue of
 the last will and Testament of my father John Whitehead and in pursuance
 of which it has been agreed to me by Commissioners in Obedience to an Order of the
 County Court of Southampton. And the said John Whitehead and Mary his wife
 for themselves their heirs executors administrators and assignees shall and will warrant
 and forever defend the title to the foregoing Land and premises and every part
 thereof unto the said Edwin Whitehead his heirs and assigns forever against
 themselves their heirs and against all and every other person and persons whome
 it shall happen whereof they the said John Whitehead and Mary his wife both
 hereunto set their hands and affix their seals the day and year first above
 signed Sealed and delivered
