

Barber Whereas Howell Barker dec^d died by his last will and Testament bearing date the
 To 13th day of June One thousand Eight hundred and twenty two. (witness to his wife Mabel
 Barker) Barker during her life or widowhood his tract of Land for his negro and (then)
 in case (say Jacob Peter Jeffery, Phileas Henderson, Alas and Tom and on the
 Event of either death or marriage of the said Mabel Barker to his son ^{then} Gray
 Barker to him and his heirs forever. And whereas it is contrary to the
 Laws of Virginia that any Widow should carry any Slaves or Slaves out of the
 said State without the approbation of the person or persons to whom the
 simple title is vested I do hereby agree that my mother Mabel Barker
 should remove the said Slaves to Kentucky or any other State that she
 may wish and that she may have the same right and Control over them that
 she would have if she had remained in Virginia. Given under my hand &
 Seal this 18th day of February 1833.

Whithead This Indenture made and entered into this twenty fifth day of September One
 To thousand Eight hundred and twenty two Between John Whithead and Mary his wife
 of the One part and Edwin Whithead of the other part all of the County of
 Whithead Kentucky. Witness that the said John Whithead and Mary his wife
 for and in Consideration of the Sum of four hundred and fifty dollars to him
 in hand paid by the said Edwin Whithead the receipt whereof is hereby
 acknowledged back by these presents, granted bargained and sold (and do hereby
 grant bargain and sell unto the said Edwin Whithead his heirs and assigns) all
 certain tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Smithampton containing
 a late Survey two hundred and eleven acres be the same more or less and bounded
 by the Lands of Hannibal Whithead, Elbert Hannibal, Josephus Hansen and John
 Newton. It being that tract or parcel of Land which descended to me by descent
 the last will and Testament of my father John Whithead and in pursuance of
 which it has been agreed to me by Commissioners in obedience to an Order of the
 County Court of Smithampton. And the said John Whithead and Mary his wife
 for themselves their heirs executors administrators and assigns shall and well warrant
 and forever defend the title to the foregoing Land and premises and every part
 thereof unto the said Edwin Whithead his heirs and assigns forever against
 themselves their heirs and against all and every other person and persons with
 In witness whereof they the said John Whithead and Mary his wife have
 hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first above
