This day personally appeared before us Sheriff Harris and Robert Schuyler and Justice of the Peace for the County and State of Virginia and Mary Whitehead wife of John Whitehead who being examined privately and apart from her husband and having the nature of the foregoing deed fully explained to her both in English and French she declared that she is willingly and without any constraint, signed sealed and delivered the above deed and wishes not to retract it. John Whitehead This Indenture made and entered into this 4<sup>th</sup> day of February one thousand eight hundred and thirty three between Edson Whitehead and Martha Ekin wife of Grenville Whitehead County State of Virginia of the one part and Harriet Whitehead of Southampton County and slave aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Edson Whitehead and Martha Ekin wife for and in consideration of the sum of Edson hundred dollars to them in hand paid by the said Harriet Whitehead the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged each hath by these presents granted bargain and sold one do hereby grant bargain and sell unto the said Harriet Whitehead her heirs and assigns one certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton containing by a late survey three hundred and fifty one acres be the same more or less and bounded by the lands of John Newton Sheriff Harris, Joseph Blanton, Wm. Rooks her and the lands of Samuel Turner. And the said Edson Whitehead and Martha Ekin wife for and in full and lawful discharge of the said Harriet Whitehead her heirs and assigns shall and lawfully warrant and defend the title to the foregoing land and premises and every part thereof unto the said Harriet Whitehead her heirs and assigns forever against all and every other person and persons, whatsoever. All which are the terms of the said Edson Whitehead and Martha Ekin wife their heirs and assigns to be their hands and affixed their seals the day and date above written.
