of the second part and George A. C. Parkham of the third part. Witnesseth that whereas
the said William J. Perkins and Cutbush D. Parkham had become bound for the said John
Whitehead in the Clerk's Office of the aforesaid County for the sum of five thousand
dollars as and in consideration for an estate committed to him the said John Whitehead and
as Guardian of William H. Whitehead, a son of William A. Whitehead dec'd and for
the further sum of One dollar in hand paid by the said George A. C. Parkham
know in Order to secure and save harmless the said William J. Perkins and Cutbush
D. Parkham from the payment of the aforesaid sum of five thousand dollars
or any part thereof of the said John Whitehead and Mary his wife each joint
severally and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said
George A. C. Parkham his heirs and assigns One certain tract or parcel of land
lying in the County aforesaid containing by estimation seven hundred acres more
