Williamstown This Indenture made and entered into this 6 day of November of the year of our Lord To one thousand Eight hundred and thirty two. Between David Williams and Mary Ann his wife of the one part, and James Holmes of the other part Witnesseth that the said David Williams and Mary Ann his wife for and in consideration of the sum of nine hundred and sixteen Current money of Virginia to them in hand paid or secured to be paid by the said James Holmes at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents Have Bargained and sold and by these presents do hereby bargain and sell unto the said James Holmes his heirs and assigns a certain tract of Land lying and being in the County of Southampten containing by estimation three hundred and eighty three acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a white oak stand on the side of the Cypress Swamp a corner of Amos Canale lands thence along George Williams' line to Elizabeth Williams' line thence along said Williams' line thence along said Sumner's line thence along said Sumner's line to the Cypress Swamp to Joseph Smith's line thence along said Sanborn's line to said Sumner's line thence along said Sumner's line to Edwin Ely's line thence along said Ely's line to the Cypress Swamp and thence along said Swamp to the above named white oak, the first station together with the several and several remainder and remaining parts and other parts of said land with every part and parcel thereof To have and to hold the said tract of Land with
