Little wife of John Gentry made this 20th day of February in the year of our Lord 1833 Known to Sampson Little and Eliza his wife of the One hundred and William J. Gillett of the aforesaid
Sobell all of the County of Southampton Wtchappell that the Said Sampson Little and Eliza
his wife in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and twenty five dollars to him in
hand paid have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and
sell unto the Said William J. Gillett his heirs all of a certain part or parcel of land
in the County of Southampton aforesaid containing there being a large
red oak in Jermiah Hobbs and Alvin Butts line there being nearly a mile to a white
oak in a branch stems East to a pine on the side of a branch there being a number
of the tree branches to a paper gum on the side of the Spanish oak standing there
down the run of the said stream to the said Little's line there being the said stream
and running nearly west along the said Little's line to the first Indian and on
turning by estimation forty five acres be the same more or less to have and to hold the
said parcel of land together with the appurtenances to him the said William J. Gillett
and to his heirs and assigns and the Said Sampson Little and Eliza his wife of this and
each of their heirs executors and administrators the said parcel of land with the appurte-
