 First of Record in the County of Southampton County is in trust to the said Richard A. Wagon
 Grant and Titulus R. Edwards for the benefit of John Wagon the interest which the
 said John Wagon has in a certain tract of land in the County of Sussex known by the name
 of the Spring Swamp plantation and the said Gray having purchased the said land
 by their security given for the debt for which the said land was conveyed in trust to
 requires of the said Wagon to release to him the said interest in the Spring Swamp
 plantation which he the said Gray held in his own right and also the interest in
 the purchase formerly belonging to his brother Edwin Gray which are the interests
 to an after said of an then Indenture between said John Wagon and in consideration of the sum
 of one hundred and for and in consideration of the sum of five dollars each to them the said
 Richard A. Wagon, and Titulus R. Edwards to them in hand paid by the said John
 Gray at or before the signing, and delivery of these presents, the receipt to him of or for the
 acknowledges each, granted, bargained, sold, released, and conveyed to the said Gray
 and to the knowledge and consent of the said John Wagon, all the right title
 and interest in and to the said land or interests in the said Spring Swamp plantation
 to him the said Gray husband and assigns forever and the said Richard A. Wagon
 and Titulus R. Edwards for themselves their heirs, executors, &c. well and do hereby given con-
 sent and assent to the said Gray the aforesaid interests in the Spring Swamp plantation
 against the claim of them the aforesaid Wagon and Edwards or all and every person
