Plaints To Adkins This Indenture made this 7<sup>th</sup> day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirty three Between William T. Clements of the first part and Howell & Atkins of the second part of the County of Suffolk New York that the said William T. Clements for and consideration of the sum of One dollar to him in hand paid by the said Howell & Atkins the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged to have granted given and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Howell & Atkins and to his husband affirms forever two certain pieces or parcels of land lying and being in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows first piece to wit by the lands of Charles Merchant their Geo and Howell & Atkins containing three acres be the same more or less the second piece is bounded by the lands of Richard Knibell Butly Charles Merchant their Geo and James Hammett containing eight acres and be the same more or less to have and to hold the said premises above mentioned and described to the said Howell & Atkins her heirs and affirms forever and that the said William T. Clements do covenant grant and agree to and with the said Howell & Atkins the above bargained premises on the quiet and peaceful possession of the said Howell & Atkins his heirs and affirms against all persons during the whole of any part thereof will forever warrant and defend Intitul'd whereof we have hereunto set our hand and seals the day and year above written:

Hodges To Browns This Indenture made this 29<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year Eighteen hundred and three between William Hodges of the County of Chancery of the one part and Lafayette Brown of the County of Warren and State of North Carolina of the other part witnesseth that the said William Hodges in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars to him in hand paid by the said Lafayette Brown at or before the writing delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said Lafayette Brown his heirs and affirms One undivided third part of the tract or parcel of land of which his father William Hodges did situate and possessed estate in the County of Southampton the whole tract containing three hundred and eighty acres more or less and bounded by Edward Brown and Fairman his wife to the said William Hodges by deed bearing the 15<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year 1811 and recorded in the County Court of Chancery on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year 1820 together with all the hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said undivided third part of the said tract or parcel of land belonging or appertaining or with the same used and enjoyed or accepted taken or known as part, parcel or member thereof or as belonging to the same part thereof and the reversion and reversions remaining unexpired and remained open wherewithal and profits thereof are of every part and parcel thereof to have
