The Indenture made and entered into betwixt the 15<sup>th</sup> day of April for the years of our  
 one thousand Eight hundred and Thirty three between Edgar H. Parsons of Smithfield  
 quia of the One part and Henry Blas of Suffolk County of North Carolina of the  
 part. It is agreed that whereas James Blas of the aforesaid County of Smithfield Esq.  
 died in trust bearing date the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1831 which had been duly recorded  
 in the Clerk's Office of the County of Smithfield Conveyed to Edgar Parsons for the purpose  
 of having all his the Said James Blas put out of the tract of land wherein  
 Blas resided at the time of the execution of the Will of trust aforesaid being the said  
 tract of land that was Conveyed to the Said James Blas by Henry Blas and Elizabeth  
 his wife containing by estimation three hundred and thirty acres be the same more or  
 less to the reference to the aforesaid Deed from Henry Blas and Elizabeth his wife  
 James Blas the bondman &c. thereof will fully appear and whereas the said Edgar  
 Parsons in accordance with the requisition of the aforesaid Deed did with  
 19<sup>th</sup> of November 1832 sell the aforesaid tract of land when Henry Blas became  
 the purchaser thereof being highest bidder and be the said Henry Blas now  
 a Conveyance of the same which the said Edgar Parsons is willing to execute  
 this Indenture further wherefore the said Edgar Parsons for and in consideration  
 of the sum of twelve hundred and fifty One dollar to the said Henry  
 to the Said Edgar Parsons in hand paid or to be paid hath granted to  
 and sold do by these presents grant bargains and sell Convey and make over to the  
 said Henry Blas his heirs adme<sup>r</sup> or exec<sup>r</sup> the aforesaid tract of land containing  
 three hundred and thirty acres be the same more or less with all the privileges  
 appurtenances there unto belonging to the said Henry Blas his heirs adme<sup>r</sup>  
 and exec<sup>r</sup> and the said Edgar Parsons for himself his heirs adme<sup>r</sup> and exec<sup>r</sup>  
 doth forever quit claim whatever which he delivered to the said land by the said his  
 Trust aforesaid to the said Henry Blas and will moreover warrant and defend such  
 title only against the claim or claims of any person or persons whomsoever with  
 the said Henry Blas his heirs and assigns. In witness whereof the said Edgar
