Bolling B. Wick and Lydia his wife of the first part and Matthew Wick of the second part of the
County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesseth that for and in Consideration of the sum of
Three hundred and twenty five dollars in hand paid by the said Matthew Wick to the said Boling
Wick those except a hereby acknowledged the said Boling Wick and Lydia his wife have
granted bargained and sold and do hereby these presents grant bargain sell and convey unto
the said Matthew Wick and his heirs forever One Certain tract or parcel of Land lying
and being in the County aforesaid Containing Seventy five acres be the same more or less
and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a post set at a corner of Jordan's land thence to a post at
corner between Benjamin Penn and Jacob Jordan thence down Penn's line to a small post
oak thence by Jacob Wick's line to Egan Wick's a corner thence to the beginning with all and
singularly the appurtenances thereto belonging to his only proper use the right and true estate
land and appurtenances lawfully claimant and defend unto the said Matthew Wick
against the claim of ourselves or any person whatever In Testimony whereof we have
hereunto set our hands and affixed our Seals the day and year first above written.

named Archer formerly the property of Col. Henry Blair dec'd unto Sape Brewery his
