 for and in Consideration of the sum of One hundred and eighty dollars to him in hand
 paid by the said Harris or Cobb the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged bargain and sold
 and do hereby these presents bargain and sell forever unto the said Harris and parcel of land be-
 lying by survey State and at home my lot of my father Fiddell's land and is bound
 ed as follows. Beginning at a post oak a new corner between this tract and Sept. Cobb's
 thence S 28th E 1/2 poles along the ~~new~~ line between this tract Sept. Cobb's & Fiddell's
 to a Roger or a new corner between Fiddell's and this tract thence S 67th W. 1 1/2 poles to
