Witness that the said James Cobb has for and in Consideration of the sum of One hundred and Eighty dollars to him in hand paid by the said Harris or Cobb the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged bargain and sold by these presents bargain and sell forever unto the certain tract and parcel of land containing by Survey Sixty acres situate my lot of my father Fed.
