This Indenture made this 17 day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three Between Samuel Kello and Mary A. R. Kello his wife of the one part of the County of Southampton and John R. Kello of the other part of the County of Middlesex that the said Samuel Kello and Mary his wife for the Consideration of the sum of five hundred and fifty seven Dollars to them in hand paid by the said John R. Kello at or before the executing and delivery of these presents have bargained and sold and by these do bargain and sell unto the said John R. Kello his heirs and assigns forever their half of the Mill formerly known as Rich Lewis Mill and purchased at public sale by the said Kello and Robert C. Hammond in conjunction also sixty four acres of land then detached & being one half of the Mill tract purchased with said Mill by the said Samuel Kello to have and to hold together with all the reversions and remainders & commandments, repairs and other contingencies and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof together with all the houses, orchards, ways, water courses and privileges thereto attached whatsoever belonging in any way or wise appertaining thereto except the privileges and use of a Bed of Mail on said land near the old Mill but which Mail we reserve one half of our proportion to our use and our heirs forever the other half for proportion to the use of the said John R. Kello his heirs and assigns forever To hold the said Mill and land to have the said John R. Kello to have and to hold his forever and the said Samuel Kello and Mary his wife for themselves their heirs and assigns doth warrant and forever defend by these presents any person or persons claiming or demanding the same or any part thereof In Testimony whereof the said Samuel Kello and Mary his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the date and year first above written
