 To thousands Eight hundred and Forty Three between Randolph Fowler and William
 Edwards of the first part and Jordan Edwards of the second part all of the County of Rich-
 ampton and State of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said Randolph Fowler and
 Ex. & deliv. 5 William his wife have for and in consideration of the Sum of One hundred and two
 from Edwards dollars to them in hand paid by the said Jordan Edwards the receipt whereof is
 July 24, 1837 hereby acknowledged, conveyed and sold and do by these presents bargain and sell
 a certain and confirm unto the said Jordan Edwards his heirs, Executors and assigns
 forever One certain tract and parcel of land lying in the County of Buchanan
 Kentucky Parish containing by Survey fifty four acres and two rods and in hands
 as follows Viz Beginning at a red oak on the hill thence S. E. 88° to a pine thence
 the said thence S. D. 101° 30' to a pine thence S. D. 61° 10' to a pine thence S. E. 83°
 poles to a pine thence S. 66° W. 62° to the corner the pole of Indian Branch then
 between this tract and the Creek of Sanders tract thence down the said run
 29. E. 28° along a line of marked trees to a Black gum thence S. D. 81° poles
 to a Black gum along the said run thence down the down the said run
 the Run of Coves thence S. 52° to a m. Black gum a new corner between
 this tract and the said Randolph Fowler at the crossing near a cedar
 Sanders's thence S. 31° 34' W. 60° poles to a new line of marked trees
 to a m. water oak at the path thence S. 75° W. 74° poles along the said new
 line to a m. white oak at the path thence S. 15° W. 26° to a m. pine thence
 S. 74° to a pine thence S. 13° 46' 16' to the beginning To have and to hold
 the above said land with all its rights and appurtenances or appurtenances and remainders or remainders
 and every part and parcel thereof and thence to belong forever free from
 the claim or claims demand or demands of every person whatsoever And the
 said Randolph Fowler and William his wife do for themselves their heirs and
 assigns warrant and defend the same forever free from all the claims or
 claims demand or demands of all and every person whatsoever. In Witness
