This Indenture made this 1st day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Thirty Three between William Bales of the first part Benjamin Whitfield of the second part and Cordy Whitfield of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Whereof that whereas William Bales do owe to Benjamin Whitfield a debt due by notes executed to him by the said William Bales to the amount of two hundred and fifteen dollars and seventeen and a half cents in the said William Bales being anxious and desirous to secure the said Benjamin Whitfield in the full and true payment of the above mentioned debt and to secure the same as far as in consideration of the sum of One dollar to him in hand paid to said Cordy Whitfield the receipt whereof the said William Bales did hereby acknowledge and granted bargained and sold and by these presents did grant give and sell alien assign off and confirm unto the said Cordy Whitfield his heirs assigns forever the following articles of property (to wit) One bay colt one brown horse and pair Two feather beds and furniture One painted chest Three Trunks One portable One of andirons four iron pots One large sheet iron sitting chair One set knives and forks a parcel of crockery ware with all household and kitchen furniture three ploughs and one day's three cutting axes two working shoes with all their farming implements my present crop of Corn pease and crop of Cotton To have and to hold the said property unto the said Cordy Whitfield his heirs and assigns forever that upon this express Condition that if the said William Bales shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid all the said Bonds entered and not that the said Benjamin Whitfield holds against the said William Bales then and that Case it shall be lawful and it is hereby agreed to by all the parties to this
