This Indenture made this 1st day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three between William B. Bales of the first part Benjamin Whitfield of the second part and Cordy Whitfield of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Whereby it is shewed that the said William Bales doth owe unto Benjamin Whitfield in a Debt due by notes executed to him by the said William Bales to the amount of two hundred and fifteen dollars and seven cents and a half cents in the said William Bales being anxious and desirous to secure the said Benjamin Whitfield in the full and true payment of the above mentioned Bonds and notes thereinunto as for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar to him in hand paid by the said Cordy Whitfield the receipt whereof the said William Bales doth hereby acknowledge & hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth give and sell alien assign off and confirm unto the said Cordy Whitfield his heirs assigns forever the following articles of property (to wit) One bay coll one Cow one Two Sows and pigs One feather bed and furniture One painted Sheet Three Trunks One portable One of Andersons spin in pots One large Sheet one new sitting Chair One set Knives and forks a parcel of Crockery ware to wit all household and kitchen furniture three plinches one and one dozen three Cutting axes two working shoes with all their farming implements my present Crop of Corn & peas and Crop of Cotton To have and to hold unto the said property unto the said Cordy Whitfield his heirs and assigns forever shal up upon this express Condition that if the said William Bales shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid all the said Bonds entered and not the said Benjamin Whitfield holds against the said William Bales then and in that case it shall be lawful and it is hereby agreed to by all the parties to this
