And whereas in pursuance of said decree the said Septe Parker and Samuel Story Comptons as aforesaid did on the 21st day of March 1833, in pursuance of public Sale to the highest bidder One half of the said tract or parcel of land lying in Southampton County of which said Creek did lie, purposed as aforesaid notice of the time and place of sale having been given three weeks in Conformity to said decree, when William P. Cribb became the highest bidder and purchaser of the One half of the said tract or parcel of land for the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars aforesaid hereby a final decree passed by the said County Court of Southampton at the August Term 1833 upon report returned and filed in the said cause at the same term 1833, no exception were ever filed it was further decreed and ordered that the claimants who reported in the cause made to the purchaser due stockholders warranty This Indenture therefore witnesseth witnesseth that the said Septe Parker and Samuel Story Comptons as aforesaid as well for and in consideration of the sum aforesaid of the sum of One dollar to them in hand paid by the said William P. Cribb the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and granted by him and sold, alured uncoffred and Confirmed and do by these presents grant, bargain alien encoff and Confirm the One half of the said tract or parcel of land before named and which was sold at public Auction as aforesaid, To have and hold the said moiety of the said tract or parcel of land with the premises and tenures before mentioned against the claim or claims demand or demands of the said Septe Parker and Samuel Story their heirs and assigns, their executors, administrators and successors defend by virtue of the decree aforesaid and no more.
