Witness that the said Samuel Soper and Margaret his wife in consideration of the sum of thirty dollars thirty One and quarter Cents to them with him paid by the said William Bradshaw have the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have given granted bargained and sold unto the said William Bradshaw and his heirs One lot or parcel of land lying and containing beginning at a point in Lawrence Soper's line thence along Soper's line to the Stone of William Bradshaw's line thence along the said Bradshaw's line to a Black gum a corner tree standing in Frank's Branch thence up the main's corner of the turn road Frank's Branch to small Branch emptying in said Frank's Branch thence up the main's corner of the turn road to the said small Branch to the beginning by estimation twenty four and quarter acres to the land more or less To have and to hold the said parcel of land together with all and singular its appurtenances to him the said William Bradshaw and his heirs Executors and assigns forever the said parcel of land with all its appurtenances to him the said William Bradshaw and his heirs forever and the said Samuel Soper and Margaret his wife their heirs Executors and assigns the said parcel of land with all its appurtenances to him the said William Bradshaw his heirs and assigns shall and will warrant and forever defend.
