 of eight hundred and Eighty five dollars to them secured to be paid before the day
 J. G. Mason delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged has given her
 Aug 19th 1834 and sold and by these presents do grant bargains and sell unto the said Sterling
 Shely a certain tract or parcel of Land situated in the County of Pamplin and
 bounded as follows to wit beginning at a Bridge on the North side of the Mill Branch
 where the said Creek, a Creek to William Prince thence along the said Creek
 the said Prince's land as it meanders, to a pine a corner to Benjamin Lewis's
 his line N 16 W 36 poles to a Branch down the said Branch and meanders to
 Mill Branch, up the said Branch to a ditch in which it had been Turned up
 said Ditch and Branch to the beginning. To have and to hold the said parcel
 Land containing One hundred and Sixty Seven acres to the same more or less
 the said Sterling Shely his heirs and assigns forever and the said Mason and
 Covenant with the said Shely that he shall have quiet possession of the said tract
 and a good title to the same, against the claim of all persons whatever
 whom of the said Mason and wife have hereto set their hands and seals the
 and year aforesaid.
