 this Indenture further Witnesseth that the said James Richelle ^{of the County of}
 well amicus of the said John Thomas did for and in consideration of the said sum of
 hundred and forty Eight dollars and 75^{cts} to him in hand paid by the said Amos
 at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof being
 hath bargained and sold and by these presents does grant bargain and sell unto the
 said Amos Stephenson the above tract or parcel of land containing to him in
 forty seven acres as aforesaid and which bounded as follows to wit. Beginning at
 small Branch running thence N 15° W 93 Poles to a maple standing at the head of
 small branch thence the Rivers Course of that Branch to the great branch thence along
 great Branch to the head of the same thence along the Rivers Course of the
 Branch to an other small Branch and from thence S 31° W 38 Poles to a post oak at
 of Joseph Synner (now Thomas) thence S. R. 88 Poles to a black Oak
 a corner of said Joseph Synner (now Thomas) and the said tract
 at 74. 89 Poles to a gum tree the head of a small Branch thence along that Branch
 poles to the first station To have and to hold the above described tract of land
 with all and singular the premises and appurtenances thereto belonging unto the
 said Amos Stephenson his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever
 only for ever use and behoof of the said Amos Stephenson his heirs Executors and
 administrators for ever And the said James Richelle administrator with the last
 amicus of John Thomas deceased shall and will by these presents warrant and
 defend the right and title of the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises
 said Amos Stephenson his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever
 the claim or claims of all and every person or persons claiming by through or under him
 as the amicus Tutor &c of the said John Thomas deceased In Witness whereof

This Indenture made this 17th day of December in the year 1832 between
 Richard Nicholson of the County of Southampton of the first part Augustine
 of the County of Greensville of the second part and John F. Mason, Richard
 and John D. Hart of the third part all of the State of Virginia
 whereas the said John F. Mason, Richard Stewart and John D. Hart
 this day become the securities of the said Richard Nicholson for the payment
 the sum of Three thousand dollars lawful money of Virginia due by
 Robert Murray and the said Nicholson being willing and disposed to discharge
 said securities from any damage by having to pay said amount and also for
 consideration of the sum of five dollars of like money to the said Richard Nicholson
