This Indenture made this nineteenth day of August One Thousand Eight Hundred and thirty three between Spearley Williams Comptroller appointed by the Court of the County of Southampton bearing date Some Court One Thousand Eight Hundred and thirty three of the one part and the land and Slaves of Caroline E. Williams dec^d of the One part and the other part. Witnesseth that the said Spearley Williams Comptroller for and in consideration of the Sum of One Thousand three hundred and eighty seven and twenty two Cents to him in hand paid hath granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed by these presents doth grant bargain sell and confirm unto the said Williams his heirs and assigns forever One certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid containing by recent survey two hundred and ninety half acres be the same more or less the land which belonged to the late Nicholas Williams dec^d and by his will bequeathed by him to his son Nicholas Williams dec^d and by his will bequeathed by the lands of William Pordell, Jeremiah Gold, Benjamin Gold, Butts and the Spanupock Swamp together with all houses, Orchards, woods, water, Coves, profits, advantages and appurtenances therunto belonging. To Have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land and premises with them and every of them appurtenances unto the said William Pordell his heirs and assigns forever and the said Spearley Williams as Comptroller also said, do and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. This Indenture made and entered into the 8th day of August One Thousand Eight hundred and thirty three between Peter Edwards of the County of Southampton and Robert Harris of the County and State aforesaid of the one part. Witnesseth that the said Peter Edwards for and in consideration of the Sum of five hundred and eleven Pounds paid on or before the sealing and delivery of these presents hath acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell to the said Robert Harris his heirs and assigns forever One certain tract or parcel of land containing One hundred Acres be the same more or less being in the County aforesaid and being part of the tract of land formerly owned by the late dec^d and being all of the land belonging to said tract of land which was of Holliday's Road or the Road leading from Blayney's Bridge to Jerusalem by the place commonly called the White Chimney and bounded as follows to wit by Holliday's Road and on the East West and North by the lands of the said Harris. To have and to hold the said One hundred acres of land with all appurtenances therunto belonging to the said Robert Harris his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Robert Harris his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Peter Edwards for himself and his heirs doth hereby warrant and forever defend the title to the said lands and premises to the said Robert Harris
