This Indenture made this 19<sup>th</sup> day of August 1833 Between William Davis and his wife of the County of Southampton and Parish of St. Edmund of the one part and Samuel Davis of the same County of the other part. Whereas it is agreed that the said William Davis and wife for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and Sixty Five Dollars and Five Shillings to have and to hold in trust by the said Samuel Davis the receipt whereof is acknowledged by the said William Davis and wife doth acknowledge themselves fully and amply Interfaced and granted bargained sold and confirmed and by these presents doth grant and sell unto the said Samuel Davis one certain tract or parcel of land and premises situate and lying and being in the County aforesaid containing by a late Survey One acre and twenty five acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows To wit Beginning at a Black Elm Standing in a Swamp Called Stotteray Swamp running thence to the line of marked trees to a small branch thence along the branch to Thomas Hill Pond thence down the said Mill Pond the main course to the fork of the said Pond thence along that fork to Stotteray Swamp thence along thence to the first station with all the houses edifices and improvements thereon water courses whatsoever in any wise appertaining. To have and to hold the said land to him the said Samuel Davis to him and his heirs forever and the said William Davis his heirs and assigns that the said William Davis and wife his wife forever defend all rights title claims or demands of any part or part thereof or person claiming or demanding the same. In Testimony whereof the said William Davis and wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals this day of August above written.
