full sum of One Thousand dollars to be paid to the said Governor and his successors or relieved
of the Commonwealth for the payment of one thousand dollars to be made on his arrival on our
said Earth and remitt to him jointly and severally by these presents dated with us
this and dated the 21st day of October 1833.

The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the Court of Southampton
County have appointed the above bound, John M. Bentley, Commissioner of the Revenue for the
District of Saint Lukes in the said County, and if the said John M. Bentley shall faithfully per-
form the duties of the said Office during the term of office & then the above obligation to be rendered
above remain in full force and virtue:

This Indenture made and entered into the sixth day of November one thousand
eight hundred and thirty three between Henry Barrow and Rebecca his wife of the County of
Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Robert T. Margrave of the
County and State aforesaid of the other part. Whereas that for and in consideration
of the sum of two hundred dollars to the said Barrow in hand paid by the said Margrave
Margrave by receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Henry Barrow and Rebeccas wife
in witness have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell to the
Nov 30 1833. Margrave his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in
the County of Southampton and State of Virginia and being the tract of land which
formerly constituted part of Jno. A. Rogers' tract, and by a Judgment of the County Court
of Southampton County was awarded by a jury to said Barrow in the year one thousand
seven hundred and and given by the said Jno. Barrow by his last Will and Testa-
ment to the said Henry Barrow his grand son: and bounded as follows on the North by
the land of Joe Island, on the East by the land of Joe Island, and the said Margrave
on the South by the lands belonging to the Estate of Thos. Mason esq; and Norrington
Ellis and on the West by the land of Lewis Drew. The line running as follows. Beginning
at a common wood at Snedes branch thence N 30 West 114¹/₂ poles to a pine, thence N 7¹/₂
W 56 poles to a pine in J. A. Islands line then along Islands line N 70 West 88 poles to a
black oak then S. 8° W 65 ft. to the redy branch then down S. 28° W 34 poles to a cotton oak a corner in what was Jno. Islands line thence east 45 poles to a
pine S. 10° E 87 ft. to a white oak then S 15° W 126 poles to a dead w. oak stump
then S 29° E 82 poles to a Spanish oak, then S 66° East 10 ft. to a pine in the head of Cox's
Swamp then down the S. Swamp 41.10 East 26 poles then S 23 East 10 poles then S 55°
E 22 poles N 13° East 18 poles, to the mouth of Snedes branch, thence up the rear of said
