Whereas that whereas the said Ann Nicholson is indebted to the said Richard Stewart in the sum of three hundred dollars or thereabouts due by Bonds and moreover that the said Richard Stewart stands bound for about two thousand seven hundred dollars with interest two or three years for the said Ann Nicholson to Samuel Blunt Guardian to Revd A. Blunt And the said Ann Nicholson Stewart by justly willing and desirous to save the said Richard Stewart from any damage suffered by her in the premises and also for and on consideration of the sum of five dollars in sum paid by the said Augustin C. Butts before the signing sealing and delivery of this Indenture, hath granted bargained sold alined and conveyed and by these presents doth grant, bargain sell, aline and convey unto the said Augustin C. Butts his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit all her household and kitchen furniture, stock of every kind plantation utensils Carriages and Harness and all other property which she holds in fee simple, together with all the interest which she holds in the lands and slaves of the Estate of Phil. Miller, son or her master. To have and to hold the said property and the interest above described and all the Estate right title and interest of the said Ann Nicholson therein unto the said Augustin C.
