Indenture This Indenture made this 30th day of October in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty three between Theodore Freyant of the first part, Robt C. Simmons of the second part and C. Freyant of the third part. Whereas the said Robert C. Simmons on the 18th day of January in the year of our Lord 1832 in order to secure the payment of the sum of Two hundred and Thirty dollars to the said A. C. Freyant did by Indenture of trust of the date Convey to the said Theodore Freyant his heirs Executrix the following property to wit two negroes by the names of Lewis and Columbus, upon trust for the uses and purposes in the said indenture mentioned: And whereas since the executing and delivering of the said deed of Trust the said Robert C. Simmons hath fully satisfied and paid to the said A. C. Freyant the several sums of money thereby secured which the said A. C. Freyant doth hereby acknowledge & on this Indenture witnesseth that for the consideration aforesaid as well as for the further Consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said Robert C. Simmons to the said A. C. Freyant and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said A. C. Freyant with the aforesaid as well as for the further Consideration of the said A. C. Freyant signified by his being party to these presents and the said A. C. Freyant have granted bargained and sold remised released and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain and sell, remise release and confirm unto the said Robert C. Simmons all the estate right title interest claim and demand both at law and in Equity, which the said A. C. Freyant and A. C. Freyant have or has in the slaves above described. To have and to hold the said slaves to the said Robert C. Simmons his heirs Executrix ad*m* and assignees to the only purpose and behoof of him the said Robert C. Simmons his heirs Executrix ad*m* and assignees forever. And the said A. C. Freyant for himself his heirs Executrix and admiring the above mentioned slaves unto the said Robert C. Simmons his heirs Executrix in as full and ample manner as the same were warranted by the said Robert C. Simmons by the deed of trust above recited do warrant the same to the said Robert C. Simons against the claim or claims of him the said A. C. Freyant and all persons claiming by or under him.
