Freight *to* *Summons* This Indenture made this 24th day of October in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty three between Theodore Freight of the first part, Robt. G. Simmons of the same part and L. C. Freight of the third part. Whereas the said Robert G. Simmons on the 18th day of January in the year of our Lord 1832 in order to secure the payment of the sum of 700 hundred and thirty dollars to the said L. C. Freight did by Indenture of trust of that date convey to the said Theodore Freight his heirs Executors &c. the following property to wit first negro boys by the names of Isaac and Cornutus, upon trust for the uses and purposes in the said indenture mentioned: And whereas since the executing and delivery of the said deed of trust the said Robert G. Simmons hath fully satisfied and paid to the said L. C. Freight the several sums of money thereby secured, which the said L. C. Freight doth hereby acknowledge. Now this Indenture Witnesseth that for the consideration aforesaid as well as for the further consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said Robert G. Simmons to the said Theo Freight and before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Theo Freight with the assent and approbation of the said L. C. Freight signed by his living party, to these presents and the said L. C. Freight have granted bargained and sold remised released and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain and sell remise released and confirm unto the said Robert G. Simmons all the estate right title interest claim and demand both at law and in Equity which the said Theo Freight and L. C. Freight have or had in the Slaves above described. To have and to hold the said slaves to the said Robt. G. Simmons his heirs Executors and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Robert G. Simmons his heirs Executors and assigns forever. And the said Theo Freight for himself his heirs Executors and administrators the above mentioned slaves unto the said Robert G. Simmons his heirs Executors &c. in as full and ample manner as the same were warranted by the said Robert G. Simmons by the deed of trust above recited. do warrant the same to the said Robert G. Simmons against the claim or claims of him the said Theo Freight and all persons claiming by or under them.
