

Mr. & Mrs. Minton make this 30th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three between William Minton and Mary Ann Minton of the County of Nansemond and State of Virginia of the first part and James Gee at present of the County of Halifax and State of North Carolina of the second part. Notethat that the said William Minton and Mary Ann his wife for and in the full consideration of the sum of One Thousand Dollars cash in hand paid them by the said James Gee the receipt therefor the said William Minton and Mary Ann his wife do by these presents hereby acknowledge and forever acquit the said James Gee of all and singular bargains and solds and do grant bargains and solds unto the said James Gee to him and his heirs forever two tracts or parcels of land lying and being in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia and being the said lands which lie in lots of Southamptons due seized and piped and devised by will to his daughter Mary Burns now Mary Ann Minton, and containing by estimation One Thousand acres, the same or less and bounded as follows by the lands of John Lee by the lands of Thomas Garrison, by the lands of Richard Garrison Jr. and by the lands of Ward Garrison and the other tract bounded as follows by the lands of D. Jones Hello, the lands of Edmund Brown, the lands of Benjamin Hines and the lands of Thomas Garrison, together with all and singular the improvements upon the same water courses, and advantages belonging to the said two tracts or parcel of land to him the said James Gee to him and his heirs forever. To have and to hold the said two tracts or parcels of land to him the said James Gee to him and his heirs forever against the claim of all and every claiming under them or their heirs and against the claim of any person whatever claiming in law or equity.
