thirty three between Richard Stephenson of the one part and James Clayton, John Evans  
Lewis & Branch, Benjamin Branch, James Lenor, and Joseph Lenor of the other part,  
acting as Trustees to Round Hill Academy all of the County of Southampton and State of  
Virginia Witnesseth that the said Richard Stephenson has this day agreed to give  
furnish and requite for a piece of land for the use of a school called Round Hill  
Academy - Containing by estimation One acre more or less together with all the right  
title claim and interest the said Richard Stephenson his heirs or assigns has in said  
Round Hill Academy lying and being situated in the County and State aforesaid  
near Round Hill Bridges, at or near the forks of the Road, at or near Lenor's
