shall advertise and sell the above described Tract of land for ready money after giving  
Ten days previous notice of the time and place of sale and from the proceeds of said  
sale first pay the said Sam'l A Darden Trustee the amount of said debt and all interest  
and costs accruing, and the surplus if any, the said Sam'l A Darden Trustee his heirs &  
shall pay over to the said John Hart his heirs Executors Administrators or assigns, and the

This Indenture made and entered into this 7<sup>th</sup> day of December in the year of  
our Lord 1833, between Benjamin W Lewis of the one part and George B Cary of the other, both  
of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia: Witnesseth that the said Benjamin  
W Lewis for and in consideration of the sum of Twelve hundred & eighteen dollars in hand  
paid, the receipt whereof he the said Benjamin W Lewis doth hereby acknowledge, hath granted  
bargained and sold, and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto the said George  
B Cary, his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or parcel of land lying, being and  
situate in the County of Southampton aforesaid, and bounded as follows viz beginning at a  
Swit gum standing on the gum branch, a corner for Robert Nicholson & Benjamin Lewis in  
Thomas Ridley's line, thence along a line of chipped trees (the line between Benjamin Lewis  
and Robert Nicholson) to Browns meadow, thence across said meadow through a body of wood  
land to the line formerly separating Mr. Diana Myrus land from the land belonging to  
the heirs of Capt. Benjamin Lewis Jr<sup>th</sup>, thence along a line of chipped trees west of several  
branches to Cary's road, thence along said road to George & B Cary line, thence along  
said line to the line dividing the land of the said Benjamin W Lewis and James O Lewis  
thence down the said line to the low grounds of the three creeks, thence along a line of trees  
to the main run of the three creeks, near the big bend of said creek, thence up the main
