This Indenture made and entered into this the 17th day of December 1833 between
 Henry B. Cloughan of the one part and Thomas C. Jones of the other part, both of the County of Southamp-
 ton, Wiltshire that the said Henry B. Cloughan for and in consideration of the sum of three thousand
 dollars to him in hand paid or secured to be paid, at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the
 receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath given, granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents
 does grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Thomas C. Jones a certain lot or piece of land,
 situate in and adjacent to the Town of Jerusalem in the County aforesaid, and containing by a
 recent survey seven and two third acres, be the same more or less, and bounded as follows, to wit: Begin-
 ning at the corner of the piazza of the house now occupied by the said Cloughan as a Tavern, a corner
 on the public land, thence N 18^o W 23^o 30 poles up the main street to a corner in Lewis C. Tringant's
 thence S 65^o 30' E 28. 8 poles a corner on Lewis C. Tringant and Henry B. Cloughan, thence S 35^o E 64
 8 poles to a public house at a corner on Henry B. Cloughan and the heirs of Henry Gentry thence
 S 62^o W 18 poles to Gentry's line, then S 8^o 30' W 86 poles to a small house built for Sabina Hamel
 thence S 64^o E 2. 33 poles to a lightwood at a corner on the heirs of Henry Gentry and Henry B.
 Cloughan, thence a straight line to the beginning, together with all the buildings and
 improvements thereon, and the appurtenances thereof of every description, also all the household
 and kitchen furniture of every description attached to, appertaining or belonging to the Tavern
 of the said Henry B. Cloughan in the Town of Jerusalem - To have and to hold the said lot
