This Indenture made and entered into this 4<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year 1834 between  
 Theodore Freeman of the first part John Royal of the second part and James Murdaugh  
 and Lewis C. Freeman of the third part. Whereas the said John Royal in the year  
 of February in the year 1830 in order to secure the payment of the sum of \$1000  
 and a kinety two cents to the said James Murdaugh and Lewis C. Freeman did the  
 Indenture of Trust of that date convey to the said Theodore Freeman the following  
 property to wit: One tract or parcel of land containing eleven and three tenths acres  
 and is bounded as follows to wit by the lands of a Joel Haddill Samuel W. ...  
 and James K. Schell, also two beds one measuring and a few half dozen sitting chairs  
 one dozen plates half dozen tin vessels for the kitchen table a spinning wheel and all  
 my household furniture upon Trust for the uses and purposes in the said Indenture  
 mentioned. And whereas since the executing and delivery of the said deed of Trust  
 the said John Royal has fully satisfied and paid to the said James Murdaugh  
 and Lewis C. Freeman the said sum of money thereby secured, which the said James  
 Murdaugh and Lewis C. Freeman do hereby acknowledge and for this Indenture  
 Witnesseth that for the considerations aforesaid as well as for the further consideration  
 of one dollar in hand paid by the said John Royal to the said Theodore Freeman  
 at and before the executing and delivery of these presents the said John Royal do hereby  
 acknowledge he the said Theodore Freeman with the assent and approbation of  
 the said James Murdaugh and Lewis C. Freeman signified by their being  
 parties to these presents and the said James Murdaugh and Lewis C. Freeman  
 have granted bargained and sold remise released and confirmed and by these presents  
 do grant bargain and sell, remise release and confirm unto the said John Royal  
 all the estate right title interest claim and demand both at Law and in Equity which  
 the said Theodore Freeman and James Murdaugh and Lewis C. Freeman then  
 or hold in the property above described: To have and to hold the said tract or parcel  
 of land and personal property above described to the said John Royal his heirs and  
 assigns forever and to the only proper use and behoof of him the said  
 John Royal his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever and the said Theodore  
 Freeman and James Murdaugh and Lewis C. Freeman for themselves their  
 heirs Executors and administrators the above mentioned land and personal property  
 unto the said John Royal his heirs Executors administrators and assigns in as full and  
 ample manner as the same was warranted by the said John Royal by the said  
 Indenture aforesaid, do warrant the said John Royal against the claim or claims  
 of them the said Theodore Freeman and James Murdaugh and Lewis C. Freeman  
 and all persons claiming by or from them. In witness whereof the parties  
 aforesaid have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first above  
 written.
