one part and James Rochelle of the other part. Witnesseth that the said John Doyal for and in Consi-
deration of the sum of seventy five Dollars to him in hand paid by the said James Rochelle at and
before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the
said John Doyal has granted bargained and sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed unto the
said James Rochelle his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land lying and
being in the County of Southampton containing sixteen and three fourths acres and bounded by the
land of Leiford Waddell, Samuel Wallis and said James Rochelle it being the tract or par-
cel of land which David Doyal purchased of William & Williams as well appears by his
Deed bearing date the day of and of Record in the Clerk's Office of Southampton
County Court which tract of land the said John Doyal became entitled to and possessed by
the death of the said David Doyal together with all and singular the premises and
appurtenances thereto belonging or in any way appertaining. To have and to hold the
said sixteen and three fourths acres of land with the tenements hereditaments and all and
singular also the premises herebefore mentioned unto the said James Rochelle his heirs and assigns
and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights members and appurtenances
unto the said James Rochelle his heirs and assigns forever to and for the only purposes
and behoof of him the said James Rochelle his heirs and assigns forever. And the said
John Doyal for himself his heirs Executors and administrators the said sixteen and three fourths
acres of land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned
unto the said James Rochelle his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of him
the said John Doyal his heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall
