 tract of land, whereof Theophania Pate, did die seized, in the County of said Southampton
 containing one hundred acres more or less bounded by the lands of the said John W. Mason
 and others, being the land allotted to the said Theophania Pate, in the division of
 the lands of her deceased husband Thomas Pate, To have and to hold the same unto
 aforesaid unto him the said John W. Mason his heirs and assigns to the only
 proper use and behoof of the said John W. Mason his heirs and assigns forever
 And the said Harris and Emily his wife for themselves their heirs and assigns
 do hereby covenant with the said John W. Mason his heirs and assigns
 that they will forever warrant and defend the interest herein before conveyed unto
 the said John W. Mason his heirs and assigns against the claim and demand of
 all and every person or persons whatsoever. In Testimony whereof the said
