 certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton and
 bounded by the lands of said Mason the lands belonging to the estate of George
 Applewhite dec'd and the lands of George W. Pette containing sixty four acres
 be the same more or less with all the improvements and profits thereto belonging
 to the said Mark T. Pette and Cherry his wife do warrant and forever defend
