Commissioners This Indenture made this 31st day of December in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand Eight hundred and thirty one. Between Benjamin Shuffin, Robert Drury and John Edwards Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Parishampton to set apart the demi of Keathes Bulls (late Bradshaw, the Widow of Jacob Bradshaw) in the land said Jacob died seized and then sold to the highest bidder the said land subject to the demi interest of the one part and Willis Bulls of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Benjamin Shuffin Robert Drury and John Edwards Commissioners did on the 31st day of December 1834 after duly assembling the same sell the land as above named to the highest bidder and Willis Bulls became the purchaser for the sum of two hundred fifty three dollars thirty six Cents for which amount we have taken Bonds and Security as required by the Deed the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged Have bargained and sold and do by these presents bargain and sell unto the said Willis Bulls his heirs and assigns forever the above named tract of land containingly a late Survey two hundred and one acres and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a pine a corner between Benjamin and Jacob Bradshaw and running N 64 1/2° E 1162.58 poles to a 4. NW 1/4 poles at 60. N 96.6 poles at 86. N 112.58 poles at 70. W 22.58 poles at 163. N 58.58 poles to an Oak a corner between Haulon Joyner and said land thence S 70. 64 poles to the Bradshaw Mill branch thence along the main course of said Mill Stream to a corner thence at 17° E 53. 44 poles thence at 6. E 8. 44 poles to the beginning together with all and singular the houses out houses edifices buildings yards, gardens, ways, water and water courses subject to the demi interest of the said Keathes Bulls late Bradshaw with the appurtenances therunto belonging To have and to hold the said two hundred acres of land unto the said Willis Bulls subject to the demi interest as aforesaid to him and his heirs
