I on this day do hereby certify that the said Barton Chitty in consideration of the premises aforesaid in the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain grant and sell unto the said James C. Taylor his heirs or assigns the following property to wit one parcel more which was purchased of the said James C. Taylor three acres of Catle two sons and pigs. To have and to hold to him the said James C. Taylor his heirs or assigns forever and the said Barton Chitty doth give him and assigns do warrant and defend the title of above mentioned property against the lawful claim of all persons to what over claim in the same or any part thereof unto the said James C. Taylor his heirs or assigns forever upon Special Trust and Confidence nevertheless that the said Thomas Porter may at any time after the 11th day of September by request of either of the parties sell for ready money all the property herein conveyed first advertising the day and place of such sale two days previously or so much thereof as shall be sufficient to discharge the aforesaid debt interest and cost including his carrying costs effect these presents.
