and State of Virginia Whereas it is agreed between the said Hardy Harris and Emily his wife for and in
consideration of the sum of thirty five hundred dollars current money of Virginia to them
said Womell to the said Harris and wife by the said Womell in hand paid the receipt whereof of the said
date 17/1/34 Harris wife do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained sold and conveyed and by these
present do grant bargain sell also Convey unto the said Louis Womell his heirs and assigns
a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County aforesaid containing seven hundred
and thirty nine acres to the same more or less as bounded as follows To wit beginning at the
intersection of Cafford's Road and Thomas' Swamp then across the said Swamp the said
corner thereof to Blair's Mill now Reddy's Pond and the intersection of that and the White
house Branch thence across that branch the Harris corner thereof to a light wood stump
a corner of Thomas' Meadowood now Ann Stephenson then along a line of marked
trees 140. 10. 6 poles then N. 25. 10. 5 poles then west 40. 0. 3 poles then N. 46. 11.
poles to the road then the same course N. 46. 11. 4 poles to a pine a corner of Thomas'
Meadowood now Ann Stephenson On the side of Bancks Road then along the said
Road N. 49. E. 2 poles then along the said Cafford's Road N. 33. E. 20. poles to the
beginning To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances
thereunto belonging to him the said Louis Womell his heirs and assigns to the only paper
use and behoof of him the said Louis Womell his heirs and assigns forever and the said
Hardy Harris and Emily his wife for themselves their heirs assigns do hereby covenant agree
to and with the said Louis Womell his heirs and assigns that the said Hardy Harris and
Emily his wife and their heirs the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances unto
him the said Louis Womell his heirs and assigns against them the said Hardy Harris
and Emily his wife their heirs and assigns and against all persons whomsoever shall and
will by these presents forever warrant and defend In Witness whereof the said
Hardy Harris and Emily his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their
seals this 1st day of January 1834.
