This Indenture made this 24 day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty between William M. Delk and James M. Delk of the one part, and Jacob M. Delk of the other part. Witnesseth that the said William M. Delk and James M. Delk in consideration of seven hundred and fifties and twenty nine Cents of lawful money of the State of Virginia, to them hereunto paid by the said Jacob M. Delk at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold, and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said Jacob M. Delk his heirs and assigns all their interest of in and to a tract or parcel of land in the County of Southampton Containing by estimation Ten Acres and seventy five acres more or less bounded by the lands of William H. Collins, John Collins, Wiley S. Delk, heirs and the main item of Black Mitter Stamp it being the land whereon Wiley J. Delk deceased formerly lived and the same land devised to the said Jacob M. Delk by the last will and Testament of a certain Delk deceased. Also all the interest of in and to another tract or parcel of land containing by estimation one hundred and five eight acres more or less part of said tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Surry and the Remainder in the County of Southampton known by the name of Wain's tract and bounded by the lands of William H. Collins, Henry M. Holloman and others first above named and Byrd Harvey it being the land purchased by Wiley J. Delk and his heirs and assigns agreeable to a decree of the County Court of Surry together with all the buildings, barns, buildings, yards, gardens, Orchard, lands, Tenements, pastures, woods, timber, etc.
