conveyance of one Edward C. Bailey to Robert Stillman both of the County of Southampton having date the 30th day
of July 1832. One thousand Eight hundred and Twenty nine for certain purposes therein mentioned and
by reference to the said deed will more fully appear of the one part, and Robert Stillman of the other
part. Witness that for and in consideration of the Sum of two hundred and ten dollars in hand
paid by the said Robert Stillman at and before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged I do hereby grant sell and convey to the said Robert Stillman his
heirs and assigns all the interest in and to which the said Edward C. Bailey claims or is entitled
to in the land of which his father Edward Bailey died seized lying in the County of Southampton
and Surry which said undivided interest in the aforesaid land was conveyed in the aforesaid deed of
Trist which was admitted and sold as is herein directed and the same was purchased by the aforesaid
said Robert Stillman for the aforesaid Sum of Two hundred and ten dollars to have and to hold
the same unto the said Robert Stillman his heirs and assigns to him and his heirs and assigns
forever And the said Joseph Stillman do covenant with the said Robert Stillman his heirs and
assigns that I will warrant and defend the same to the said Robert Stillman against the
lawful claims and demands of the said Edward C. Bailey or any other person or persons claiming
