Barham of the other part both of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia do hereby certify that the said Benjamin Lewis for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar and Seventy five Cents per acre lawful money of Virginia a part in hand paid by the said George A. C. Barham at and before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt for which of fifty dollars herebefore paid is hereby acknowledged by the said Lewis and the said Benjamin Lewis promises to pay the remainder as soon as the land shall be surveyed and the number of acres ascertained has granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said George A. C. Barham his heirs and assigns all his interest having or claiming in the whole tract in the tract of land lying and being in the County aforesaid on the north side of the three creeks and bounded by the lands of Thomas Ralby, William M. Ralby, John Ralby land has not yet been divided amongst the legacies of Benjamin Lewis deceased therefore the same cannot be defined with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said George A. C. Barham his heirs and assigns forever and the said Benjamin Lewis for himself his heirs &c. Shall and will against all claimants warrant and defend the right title and interest of said tract of land to the said George A. C.
