part and Benjamin A. Barnes of the other part all of whom are of the County of Southampton in the State
of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said John E. Barnes and Susan his wife the said William Burton
and Eliza his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Eighty Eight dollars and Eighty Eight
cents in hand paid to the said John E. Barnes and Susan his wife and the sum of Sixty one
dollars in hand paid to the said William Burton and Eliza his wife at or before the concluding
and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and
sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said Benjamin
A. Barnes his heirs and assigns all of their rights titles interests and estates whatsoever in and
of them have in and to a certain tract of land lying and being in the County aforesaid containing
the identical tract of land of which Benjamin Barnes of said County died seized (so far as)
supposed to contain about One hundred acres together with all the improvements thereon and
profits of two months of the said tract of land belonging or appertaining or with the same and
and enjoyed or accepted taken or known as partly parcel or member thereof or as belonging
to the same two months of the said tract of land or any part thereof and the revenue and revenues
thereon and remanences yearly and otherwise profits and profits thereof to have and to hold
the said interest in the said tract of land with the tenures heretofore and all and singular
other the premises hereinbefore mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and
share of every of their right members and appurtenances unto the said Benjamin A.
Barnes his heirs and assigns forever to and for the only proprieuse and behoof of him the said
Benjamin A. Barnes his heirs and assigns forever and the said John E. Barnes and Susan his
wife William Burton and Eliza his wife for themselves and their heirs the said two months of
interest as aforesaid in the said tract of land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances
