Witnessed. This Indenture made and entered into this 17th day of March in the year of our Lord 1834 by and between
 to John E. Barnes and Susan Barnes his wife William Newton and Eliza M. Newton his wife of the one
 part and Benjamin A. Barnes of the other part all of whom are of the County of Sanhampton in the State
 of Virginia With express that the said John E. Barnes and Susan his wife the said William Newton
 and Eliza his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Eighty Eight dollars and Eighty Eight
 Cents in hand paid to the said John E. Barnes and Susan his wife and the sum of sixty one
 dollar in hand paid to them the said William Newton and Eliza his wife at or before the making
 and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Susan and
 sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said Benjamin
 A. Barnes his heirs and assigns all of their rights titles interests and estates which they and each
 of them have in and to a certain tract of land lying and being in the County aforesaid siting
 the identical tract of land of which Benjamin Barnes of said County did originally propose
 supposed to contain about One hundred acres together with all the improvements rent and
 profits of two months of the said tract of land belonging or appertaining or with the same and
 and enjoyed or accepted reputed taken or known as part of parcel or manor thereof or as belonging
 to the same two months of the said tract of land or any part thereof and the revenues and revenues
 Remainder and Remainders openly and lawfully issues and profits thereof To have and to hold
 the said Interest in the said tract of land with the tenements hereto and all and singular
 other the premises hereinbefore mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and part
 thereof with every of them right members and appurtenances unto the said Benjamin A.
 Barnes his heirs and assigns forever to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said
 Benjamin A. Barnes his heirs and assigns forever and the said John E. Barnes and Susan his
 wife William Newton and Eliza his wife for themselves and their heirs the said two months or
 interest as aforesaid in the said tract of land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances
