Brown in hand paid by the said Edwin B. Claud the receipt whereof the said Orris A. Brown doth hereby acknowledge they the said Orris A. Brown and Susan S. Brown have granted and by these presents do grant bargain sell enfeoff and confirm unto the said Edwin B. Claud and his heirs forever all that tract or parcel of land, lying and being in the County of Southampton containing about twelve hundred acres of land to the same more or less and bounded by the road from Cellfield to James Row, by a road leading from the said road to the Crook Keys, by the lands of Francis S. Jones, Thomas Jones and John Phelps formerly Watry's lying the parts of two tracts of land one devised by purchase from M. B.
