And therefore made this 1st month day of February Eighteen hundred and thirty four. Between William Dorn of
the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and John Danett of the same County and State of
the other part. Whereas it is agreed between the said William Dorn and John Danett that the said John Danett shall pay
to the said William Dorn the sum of One hundred and ten dollars Current money
of his Committment to him in hand paid by the said John Danett at or before the execution and delivery of this
indenture the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged to have bargained and sold and by these presents discharged
and sold unto the said John Danett his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the
said County and State Containing about Eight acres more or less and bounded by the lands of said John
Danett and the lands belonging to the heirs of Brian Ferguson deceased being the lot or parcel of land the
said William Dorn deeded or was entitled to in the division of the lands of said Edward Dorn the boundaries
whereof fully appear by reference to the Committment Report of the division of said lands of said Edward
Dorn. To have and to hold the said tract of land with all and singular the appurtenances thereto
belonging unto the said John Danett his heirs and assigns forever to him for the only proper use and benefit
of him the said John Danett his heirs and assigns forever and the said William Dorn his heirs and
successors and assigns the said tract or parcel of land with all and singular the premises and appurte-
nances before mentioned or therunto belonging unto the said John Danett his heirs and assigns free from
the claim of him the said William Dorn his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns are free from
the claim or claims of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall will and do warrant and forever give
the right and title of said lands by these presents. In witness whereof the said William Dorn had
hereunto set his hand and Seal the day and year first above written.

And therefore made and entered into this twenty fifth day of March in the year of our Lord
thousand eight hundred thirty four Between Robert Tellusgrave and Charlotte his wife of the one part
and John Sykes of the other part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Whereas it is agreed
that for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred and fifty dollars in hand paid by the
said John Sykes to the said Tellusgrave the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the
said Tellusgrave the said Robert Tellusgrave and Charlotte his wife have granted and assigned
sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell alien and confirm
to the said John Sykes his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land
lying and being in the Parish of Saint Lakes and County and State aforesaid containing
two hundred and thirty acres to the same more or less it being a part of the tract of land which
formerly belonged to Thomas Mason deceased and lately purchased by the said Tellusgrave of the
heirs of the said Mason. The above tract of two hundred and thirty acres is bounded by the river
