Claud has become security for the said John Syles in four separate bonds accounted as follows
one to Henry M'lohn bearing date on the twenty sixth day of March one thousand eight hundred
and twenty four and payable on the first day of January next of the sum of five hundred
and sixty three Cents one to the same of the same date and same amount
the first of January one thousand eight hundred and twenty six One due to the same
